Research and Original Creative Work

The creative work of a visual artist is recognized in several ways. The artist's work may be selected for exhibition in juried shows (equivalent to refereed publications) or may be included in gallery and museum shows by invitation of a curator (these invited exhibitions often may be more important, reflecting the recognition of one's work by significant members of the art world). Other forms of recognition include representation of one's work by a respected gallery or having one's works acquired by museums and other collections. Solo shows are usually more significant and more rare than group shows as they often reflect the creation and exhibition of a larger body of work. However, some group shows can be more significant than solo shows if the curator, venue and/or impact is at a higher level. Another signifier of the importance of a show is one has a catalog with curatorial essays produced for the exhibition. Reviews by critics and selections of work for reproduction in books and periodicals are additional means of recognition within in the field. It is worth noting that the location of a show may not be a direct indicator of its importance; an exhibit of national or international stature may take place in a seemingly regional or local venue. The nature of the audience attracted to the venue contributes to the designation as well.

Art Departments within Research 1 Academic settings vary greatly. At FSU, the Department of Art is particularly complex and faculty are expected to preform an exceptionally large amount of service. This is, in large part due to two main factors. First, the substandard facilities and all of the collateral issues working in such facilities creates. Rooms not designed with studio classes in mind that are house in a 50 year old building with a history of flooding, electrical issues etc. This translates to a large part of ones time having to deal with "putting out fires" and recognizing the limits of the facilities are limiting what we can and want to do. Second, the general low number of staff FSU has historically supported, coupled with low salaries, that create a constant revolving door of people who are are expected to support, and maintain essential labs and departmental function. That means that faculty are the ones that have to oversee and train both lab techs and GAS to "run" labs that support our program. All of this is on top of the the "regular" day-to-day needs of managing a department, building and implementing curriculum, etc.. which translates to our faculty having a base AOR or 20% in service. This is much higher than most other anemic units. Normally at a Research 1 institution one would expect better facilities that support rather than hinder the circular needs of the department. One would also expect more d\full-time lab technicians and support staff that are knowledgeable and can maintain the facilities in a way that enhances the teaching mission.
